

Wright County Parks Geo-Caching Guidelines

The Wright County Parks Department supports geo-caching within the park system as a means for people to enjoy outdoor recreation in a natural setting while experiencing the serenity, resources and facilities the park system has to offer. To assist us in providing quality outdoor recreation to all users, please follow these geo-caching guidelines when placing or retrieving caches:

- Geo-caching is allowed in all Wright County Parks.
- Geo-caching is not allowed on regional trails located along CSAH 12 and CSAH 17, due to the narrow easement the trails occupy.
- Placement of geo-caches is not allowed at the following facilities within parks: campgrounds, reservation picnic areas/shelters, playgrounds, or beaches.
- Placement of geo-caches is restricted to within 25 feet of a trail and must not involve disturbance of the park's natural resources.
- There is no maximum limit to the number of geo-caches placed within an individual park; however, geo-caches must not be placed within 0.25 miles of another geo-cache.
- Placement of geo-caches within maintained landscape and plantings is prohibited.
- Geo-caches are not to contain items that are offensive, dangerous, or illegal.
- Access to geo-caches is subject to the Wright County Parks ordinance, including hours of operation, designated trail uses, and natural resources management activities.
- Wright County Parks retains the right to remove a cache if determined to be inappropriate.
