

**Moving Permit Regulations
Wright County Highway Department**

1. Moving permits are required on Wright County Highways for all vehicles or loads:
 - Wider than 10' 6"
 - Longer than 18'
 - Load weights in excess of 80,000 lbs per vehicle with a maximum of 20,000 lbs per axle.
 - **No permits shall be issued during Spring weight restriction period, even though the load may meet axle limits. This action is necessary to prevent damage to soft shoulders. Mover shall adhere to special postings on County Highways and bridges throughout the year.**

2. **Moving Permit Fees:**

Basic Single Permit Fee	\$ 25.00
Annual Permit Fee (Valid from January 1 st to December 31 st)	\$ 200.00
Overweight Fee - <u>Additional</u>	
Legal - 100,000 lbs	\$ 25.00
100,001 - 150,000 lbs	\$ 50.00
150,001 - 200,000 lbs	\$ 75.00
200,001 - 250,000 lbs	\$ 100.00
250,001 - 300,000 lbs	\$ 150.00
Over 300,000 lbs	\$ 200.00

3. All Annual Permit holders shall contact the Wright County Highway Department at (763) 682-7383 to log in their route and load information. Additional overweight fees may apply.
4. If the permittee is not able to yield the right of way to oncoming traffic or if vehicle/load encroaches into the oncoming traffic lane or if traffic must be directed or controlled, a police or sheriff's escort(s) is required and shall be operated as per Minnesota Statute 169.20, Subd. 5.
5. Permits requiring Sheriff or police escorts must be submitted to the Highway Department seven (7) working days prior to the move. NOTE: Sheriff's Department needs a five (5) day notice and mover should contact the Sheriff's Department directly during normal duty hours (8:00 a.m. - 4:30 p.m.) At (763) 682-7620 to schedule escort. Sheriff's escorts will be based on \$40/hour (plus \$10 fee) per man/unit.
6. Wide load signs and proper flagging (lighting at night) will be required for all oversize loads. Night moves shall be done in the early morning hours from 1:00 a.m. to 6:00 a.m.
7. Wright County permits that also require a Minnesota Department of Transportation (Mn/DOT) permit as part of the move shall be governed by the requirements of the Mn/DOT permit.
8. Licensed building mover means a person, corporation, or other entity who raises, supports off the foundation, and moves building on and over public streets and highways. Licensed building mover does not include a person who moves manufactured homes or modular homes, farmers moving their own buildings, or persons moving buildings which are less than 16 feet wide by 20 feet long. Buildings and structures other than these shall require a licensed mover on Wright County Highways.
