As stated in the Rule, providers must have equipment in adequate amounts for the number and ages of children in care. Equipment may be new, used, commercial, or homemade, as long as it is safe and in good condition. The following are general areas in which you should have some equipment.

Infants (per child)

___ 2 books

___ 1 soft washable toy

___ 2 large soft blocks

___ 1 noise-making toy:

- Rattles
- Squeeze toys
- Musical toy

___ 2 manipulative:

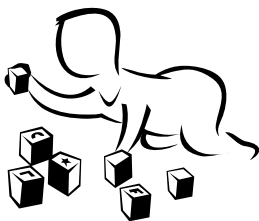
- Stacking/nesting toy
- Shape ball

___ 2 visual/tactile sensory items:

- Play gym
- Mobiles
- Posters
- Busy box

___ 1 large muscle equipment:

- Pillows to crawl over
- Jumpers
- Push toys



Toddlers (per child)

___ 2 books

___ 1 set cognitive materials:

- Puzzles
- Matching games

___ 2 sets manipulative – larger than 1”
in diameter:

- Interlocking forms
- Beads
- Building sets
- Blocks

___ 1 music-making toy

___ 1 soft washable toy:

- Dolls
- Stuffed animals

___ 1 dramatic play item:

- Play kitchen
- Workbench
- Dress-up clothes

___ 2 sensory stimulation:

- Pictures
- Shape sorter
- Fabric samples

___ 1 large muscle toy:

- Ball
- Riding toys
