### Disqualifying crimes or conduct

- Murder & manslaughter, including of an unborn child
- Criminal vehicular homicide and injury
- Suicide
- Assault, including of an unborn child, domestic assault, spousal abuse
- Child abuse, neglect, maltreatment, or endangerment
- Malicious punishment of a child
- Failure to make mandated child maltreatment reports
- A crime against children
- Injury or death of an unborn child in the commission of a crime
- Involuntary termination of parental rights or grounds for termination of parental rights
- Abuse, neglect, or financial exploitation of a vulnerable adult
- Assault by a caregiver against a vulnerable adult
- Substantiated serious or recurring maltreatment of a vulnerable adult
- Mistreatment of persons confined, residents or patients
- Failure to report maltreatment of a vulnerable adult
- Aggravated robbery, simple robbery, burglary
- Kidnapping, abduction, false imprisonment
- Solicitation, inducement, and promotion of prostitution
- Minor engaged in prostitution
- Criminal sexual conduct
- Solicitation or use of minors to engage in sexual conduct
- Possession of pictorial representations of minors
- Incest
- Arson in the first, second, or third degree
- Drive-by shooting
- Shooting at or in a public transit vehicle or facility
- Felon ineligible to possess firearm
- Dangerous weapons (spring guns, machine guns and short-barreled shotguns)
- Great bodily harm caused by distribution of drugs
- Use of drugs to injure or facilitate crime
- Chapter 152 drugs; controlled substance
- A felony level conviction involving alcohol or drug use
- Adulteration
- Riot
- Theft
- Shoplifting
- Wrongfully obtaining assistance
- Issuance of a dishonored check
- Medicaid Fraud
- Bringing stolen goods into MN
